Tech Corner

"What is a rootkit anyway?"

Sony recently had implemented in their newly produced audio CDs a simple program called "rootkit." 5 years ago, this wouldn't have been a problem - but the RIAA had enough of people distributing licensed music across the web. Now, we all feel guilty for listening to any music. Sony, thought they'd help exterminate the music pirates by putting a small program called rootkit on their audio CDs (last I checked, they got slapped on the hand for this...but they don't feel too bad.) What is a rootkit anyway? A rootkit, defined by Wikipedia.org, is "... a set of software tools frequently used by a third party (usually an intruder) after gaining access to a computer system. These tools are intended to conceal running processes, files or system data, which helps an intruder maintain access to a system without the user's knowledge. Rootkits are known to exist for a variety of operating systems such as Linux, Solaris and versions of Microsoft Windows. A computer with a rootkit on it is called a rooted computer."

What's bad about this? Well, these knuckle heads that get their jollies by writing viruses can now write their virus/trojan/spyware/malware/etc, into a rootkit program. Cox Focus Groups Provide Insight to Multicast Tuning

Dallas - Dec 12, 2005 - Following a qualitative research study conducted during November 2005, nearly nine out of ten consumers would prefer seeing HD Radio supplemental -- or multicast -- stations displayed as expanded bands instead of layered bands. In other words, instead of displaying a frequency's multicast streams as 100.7 HD1 and 100.7 HD2, the station would use a radio display of 100.7 for the HD1 stream and 120.7 for HD2.

In the national study, conducted by Bob Harper and Company and funded by Cox Radio, consumers in 12 separate focus groups were asked to discuss two possible options to display the new radio station streams made possible with HD Radio technology.

In each of the focus groups, consumers overwhelming preferred the expanded band approach of displaying new HD Radio stations. The combined results of the focus groups showed that 136 of the 156 (87.2 percent) respondents chose the expanded band approach over the layered approach.

"This is a somewhat unusual result from focus groups in general," says Bob Harper, president of Bob Harper and Company, an independent research organization specializing in radio broadcast. "An overwhelming percentage of respondents chose the expanded band over the layered approach.

In fact, in four of the sessions, the scores were 12-0, 13-0, 13-0 and 13-0 in favor of the expanded band. Typically in a focus group setting -- where there is a lot of open dialog and give-and-take -- respondents often can see the positives in more than one alternative; especially as they hear the pros and cons of one option over another. But there was very little equivocation in our three cities."

Harper adds that the findings are so conclusive that, "broadcasters and equipment manufacturers would only ignore them at their peril."

The multi-market research study was conducted between Nov. 7 and 15, 2005.

A total of 156 radio listeners between the ages of 18 and 54 participated in 12 focus groups moderated by Bob Harper. Three focus groups were conducted in both Los Angeles and Washington, DC, and six focus groups were held in Detroit. A number of radio broadcasters and receiver manufacturers responded to the invitation to advise Bob Harper and Company on the study's design as well as view the focus groups in person or online.

"As the industry moves aggressively to launch HD Radio, it is important for radios manufactured in the future to be consumer friendly and clearly display the...new stations," says Bob Neil, CEO of Cox Radio in explaining the rationale for the consumer research. In a statement, Neil noted that the first consumer HD Radio receivers will have the layered display, but he believes that "that the industry, working closely with receiver manufacturers, will use this research to develop an orderly transition plan to the expanded band as the HD Radio receiver evolves and develops."

Harper has been invited to present the results of this study at the next National Radio Standards Committee meeting in January 2006 at the Consumer Electronics Show.

Senate Confirms FCC Commissioners

Washington - Dec 21, 2005 - The United States Senate has confirmed Tennessee regulator Deborah Tate to fill the Republican seat on the Federal Communications Commission and Michael Copps to serve another term in a Democrat seat. A voice vote confirmed the nominations. President Bush has not yet nominated anyone for the remaining Republican seat.

Tate fills the remaining portion of a five-year term that expires June 30, 2007. She has been a director at the Tennessee Regulatory Authority and previously served as its chairman. She also served in various roles for two Tennessee governors.

An FCC commissioner since 2001 and previously an aide to retired Sen. Ernest Hollings, Copps begins a new five-year term that expires on June 30, 2010.

House sets Feb. 17, 2009, DTV transition date

The U.S. House of Representatives approved the budget reconciliation bill, which included the DTV Transition Act, early Monday morning setting Feb. 17, 2009, as the date certain for the close of the transition from analog to digital television.

By a vote of 212-206, the vote set the hard date for cessation of analog transmission and allocated \$1.5 billion to assist the owners of the estimated 73 million television sets used for over-the-air viewing with the purchase of a digital-to-analog converter box.

The bill eliminated a provision that would have allowed cable operators to down convert HDTV signals to SD.

A letter dated Dec. 19 to Senate Majority Leader Bill Frist (R-TN) from NAB president David Rehr urged the Senator and his colleagues to support passage of the budget reconciliation bill.

The Senate is expected to take action on the bill as early as this week.

NAB Says Hotels are Going Fast for NAB2006 Las Vegas, Dec 14, 2005. The NAB reports that its reserved room block for preferred hotels at NAB2006 in Las Vegas is now booked at 53 percent capacity, and reservations are running 30 percent ahead of last year. Because the demand is higher, the NAB suggests making hotel reservations sooner those attendees might have normally done in the past.
