


Meeting Notice

FCC Grants Temporary Public File Waiver

The National Association of Broadcasters requested a temporary waiver of public inspection file requirements because of the events involving the spread of Anthrax. The FCC issued a memorandum opinion and order stating that stations are not required to file letters and comments received from the public for a 60-day period, commencing October 25 and ending December 24.
