Minutes of the September 12, 2022 Meeting

The September meeting of Chapter 59 of the **Society of Broadcast Engineers** was held September 12, 2023 in the Logan Conference Room of the Johnson County Central Resource Library; 9875 West 87th Street, Overland Park, Kansas. Steve Hendrix, chapter chairman, was in charge. There were nine in attendance.

Hendrix called the meeting to order at 12:00 PM. He asked secretary Ben Weiss to read the minutes of the August meeting. The motion to accept the minutes was by Ed Treese and the second by Dave Buell. The motion carried by acclamation.

Chriss Scherer brought us up to date by mentioning that the recent annual election of officers resulted in electing Ted D. Hand, CPBE, 8-VSB, AMD, ATSC3, DRB as president for one year. Elected Vice president was Kevin Trueblood, CBRE, CBNT. Jason Ornellas, CBRE was elected treasurer and Geary Morrill, CPBE, AMD, CBNE was elected secretary. Each of these positions are for one year.

There was a brief discussion prompted by a question from Ed Treese asking what stations should be monitored for EAS test. It was decided that KMBZ FM, the metro area LP1 and KCMO-FM the metro area LP2 would be best.

Dave Buell mentioned that AAA recognizes SBE as a formal group organization and allowed him to save 10% on his auto insurance renewal.

John Gray, chapter program chairman, stated that the October chapter meeting will be held Monday October 16 at Zarda BBQ. Lunch and the program will be presented by Eddy Vanderkerken of SOURCERER, LLC

The motion to close the business meeting was by John Grey and the second was by Dave Buell.

Chapter President Steve Hendrix gave a continuation of his 2018 presentation about his tour of duty in Eastern Oregon where he maintained a number of mountaintop transmitter sites for Oregon Public Broadcasting.
